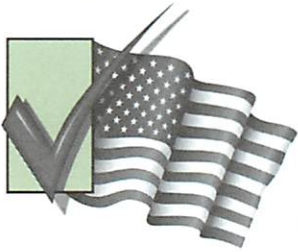

ELECTION DAY IS NOVEMBER 6, 2012



On Tuesday, November 6, citizens will go to the polls to vote in several important elections. On the national level, voters will be asked to choose the next President and Vice President. US House Representative Mick Mulvaney is running unopposed. On the state level, both Senator Harvey Peeler and Representative

Tommy Pope are unchallenged for their seats. Incumbent Bruce Henderson will face John Rinehart Sr. for the County Council District 2 seat. There are three seats up for election on the Clover School Board. Incumbents Franklin Pendleton and Melanie Wood Wilson are unopposed while incumbent Liz Johnson will face Ginger Marr for Seat 3.

There will also be a referendum question regarding Sunday sales of beer and wine at retail establishments like grocery and convenience stores. The question will read as follows: Shall the Department of Revenue be authorized to issue temporary permits in this county for a period not to exceed twenty-four hours to allow the sale of beer and wine at permitted off-premises locations without regard to the days or hours of sales?

KEEP STORM DRAINS CLEAN

It is important to remember to keep the Town's storm drains clear of all debris so as to prevent unnecessary flooding and contamination of our ponds and streams. At no time should debris of any kind be placed in the flow line of the curb or on the street. Leaves, grass clippings, other yard debris and garbage should be placed well behind the curb and never in any area that could restrict water flow. Town Ordinance prohibits obstruction of any storm drains or ditches; fines may be applied on those violating this ordinance. We ask for your cooperation by doing your part to keep our storm drains as clean as possible.
