## TOWN TO CELEBRATE QUASQUICENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY

At one time, Clover was a little station on the Chester and Lenoir Narrow-Gauge Railroad that provided water to the trains passing through. But, by faith and fortitude, the Town's population and economy grew and Clover was officially incorporated on December 24, 1887. Clover has continued to grow and prosper and now, 125 years after incorporation, is celebrating its Quasquicentennial Anniversary. Celebratory events will be held from September 2012 through March 2013. In September, the Town and Clover Public Library will join together to celebrate our Irish heritage (see article on page 2). On September 15, the Town will launch the Clover History Series Geocache. Use your GPS unit to discover Clover's past. Look for the 125th Anniversary booth at the Auto Show and Fall Festival on September 22 to purchase a commemorative booklet and coin. ## COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Town Council will be considering approval of the Comprehensive Plan 2022.
