Starting April 1st through September 30th all leaves will need to be placed in bags and put on the side of the curb for pickup. If you have any questions, please call 222-7700.

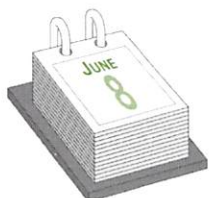


## DOG REGISTRATION

All dogs residing within the Town limits are required to be registered for the 2013 calendar year by April 30th. Registration renewals after that date will be assessed a late fee. Register your dog at Town Hall, Monday – Friday, 8am – 5pm. The cost of registration is \$4.00 per dog; after April 30th, the cost will be \$14. The Town will host a rabies clinic on April 27th from 9am – noon behind Town Hall.

## KEEP STORM DRAINS CLEAN

It is important to keep the Town's storm drains clear of all debris so as to prevent unnecessary flooding and contamination of our lakes and streams. At no time should debris of any kind be placed in the flow line of the curb or on the street. Leaves, grass clippings, other yard debris and garbage should be placed well behind the curb and never in any area that could restrict water flow. Town Ordinance prohibits obstruction of any storm drains or ditches; fines may be applied on those violating this ordinance. We ask for your cooperation by doing your part to keep our storm drains as clean as possible.

## SPRING CLEANUP NEXT MONTH



The annual spring clean up will be held May 20th – 24th. During this week only, the Town will collect hazardous, miscellaneous and bulk item (s) at the curb, like washers and dryers, refrigerators, and stoves; paint; batteries; and other items not normally accepted.
