Town offices will be closed on Monday, May 27th in observance of Memorial Day. Trash pick up will be on Tuesday, May 28th.

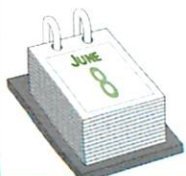
CHARITABLE SOLICITATION

The Clover Town Council passed an ordinance which now regulates the solicitation of funds from motorists. The new ordinance requires groups that want to solicit motorists for funds from Town streets to obtain a permit. Permits will only be issued to groups that meet the criteria set forth in the ordinance. For example, groups must be charitable in nature and must be located within South Carolina. Permit applications must be filed five (5) days prior to the event date. The permit will require participants to be 16 years of age or be accompanied by an adult; to wear safety vests; to conduct solicitations during daylight hours; and to hold up a sign identifying the group. The permit also sets forth a number of other safety regulations. Only two permits will be issued to an organization per calendar year. Permit applications are available at the Clover Police Department and in the Document Center under the Police Department at www.cloversc.org.

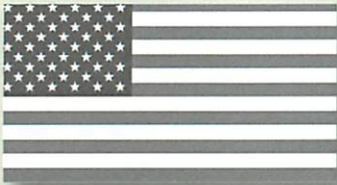

SPRING CLEANUP WEEK

In an effort to assist property owners with their clean up efforts, the Town of Clover will allow owners to place miscellaneous and bulk items at the curb for pick up from May 20-24. During this week only, the Town will collect appliances like washers and dryers, refrigerators, and stoves; paint; batteries; and any other item not normally accepted. Further, residents are encouraged to dispose of any electronic garbage, such as TV's and computers.

Items must be placed at the curb in an organized manner, separated into like piles. Call Town Hall to request an extra roll out garbage container if you will be disposing of a lot of loose items. The Town will not clean up or collect items like cars, boats, mobile homes or any other item that will not fit in the dump truck. The Town will provide assistance to elderly and handicapped citizens; call Town Hall for more information and to schedule a time.

During this week, the Town will also offer FREE shredding of personal documents. A secured bin will be placed behind Town Hall at 114 Bethel Street for the entire week. All documents placed within the bin will be shredded by a private contractor.

May is also a good time to volunteer for a litter clean-up. York County's Great American Clean Up is going on now. Contact Town Hall if you are interested in picking up litter. While supplies last, each group will receive gloves, vests and garbage bags. The Town also has grabbers to loan out. Call 222-9495 for more information.
