

## COVID-19 AND TOWN OPERATIONS

In an effort to protect the safety of our citizens and our staff, the Town of Clover is implementing several new policy changes that will change how business is conducted. The following CLOSURES AND PREVENTATIVE MEASURES HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED AND WILL BE UPDATED AS NEW, MORE RESTRICTIVE MEASURES BECOME NECESSARY OR REQUIRED. Please check our Facebook page, TOWNOFCLOVER, and also our website CLOVERSC.ORG for updated information as this situation evolves.

At the time of publication, the following Town of Clover buildings have been **CLOSED** to the public: Town Hall, Public Works, Fire Department, Development Services, and Clover Community Center (including Gallery 120). The drive thru window at Town Hall is open for service. The Police Department lobby is open for police business only. Staff is still working and ready to help you with any Town business; only the buildings are closed. Call 803-222-9495 for reopening/closure information.



Pay your water bill on-line, by telephone, at the drive-thru window or in the drop box. If you have a question about your bill, please call Town Hall at 803-222-9495.

**Water cut offs** have been suspended for March and April, 2020. The Town will **NOT** disconnect water service for non-payment for bills that were due on March 15 and also those that will be due on April 15, 2020. Also, the Town will not apply the \$30 disconnect fee if accounts are not paid during these two months. LATE FEES WILL STILL APPLY ON OUTSTANDING BALANCES. Customers are encouraged to pay what they can on their water bills so as to prevent a really high bill in May.

**Youth recreation programs** have been suspended until March 30, and will likely be suspended longer. Clover Parks and Recreation will keep in communication with all registered participants.

The **Clover Municipal Court** has limited public access only to Defendants. Please pay on-line if you have made a payment arrangement or simply want to pay the fine. March and April court will be rescheduled.

Also, if you have more bags of trash than the rollout bin can hold, please call for a special pick-up, 803-222-9495, and we will try to accommodate as best we can. Always keep the area clear six feet around your rollout so that the arm of the trash truck can grab the container.
