In an effort to protect the safety of our citizens and our staff, the Town of Clover is implemented new policies and processes that change how business is conducted. The following CLOSURES AND PREVENTATIVE MEASURES HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED AND WILL BE UPDATED AS THE NEEDED. At the time this newsletter went to press:

The following Town of Clover buildings remain **CLOSED** to the public: Town Hall, Public Works, Fire Department, Development Services, and Clover Community Center (including Gallery 120).

All water bill **payments** should either be mailed, put in the Town Hall drop box (located beside the drive thru window), paid over the phone or paid on-line at [www.cloversc.org](http://www.cloversc.org). If you are dropping off a payment at the drop box, please make sure you include your account number. If you have a question about your bill, please call Town Hall at 803-222-9495.

**Youth recreation programs** have been suspended at this time. Clover Parks and Recreation will keep in communication with all registered participants. Please call 803-222-9493 with any questions. Please use our parks responsibly by maintaining social distance from other users.

The **Clover Municipal Court** has limited public access only to Defendants. Please pay on-line if you have made a payment arrangement or simply want to pay the fine. March and April court dates have been rescheduled. Call 803-222-4084 with any questions.

**Garbage** and **yard debris** collection continue under normal schedule. However, volumes for both have increased due to stay at home order and spring cleaning. **Recycling** service will begin as soon as the York County sorting facility reopens.

## MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is always celebrated the last Monday in May. Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials.

The Town of Clover honors and thanks those men and women who have died while serving our Country. In observance, Town Offices will be closed on Memorial Day, Monday, May 25, 2020. Monday's trash service will be added to Tuesday. No other Trash service day will be effected.

## STREET NEWS

The Town's Streets Department is working hard to pick up yard debris from normal spring maintenance as well as from our Spring storms. Due to the excess volume, it will take additional time to get around to all areas. Thank you for your patience.

Help us by:

- Not mixing yard waste with other materials and garbage
- Organize yard waste into like piles. Limbs are chipped curbside and should be no more than 8' long, less than 8" in diameter, and manageable by one person.
- Grass and other clippings must be bagged before placing at curb from April 1 to Sept 30

## SPRING CLEAN UP DAYS

In an effort to assist property owners with cleaning up their properties, the Town of Clover will collect miscellaneous and bulk items at the curb from **May 18-22, 2020**. During this week only, the Town will collect appliances like washers and dryers, refrigerators and stoves, paint, batteries, and many other items not normally accepted. We will NOT collect electronic items such as computers and televisions. Residents must take these items to one of the County's Convenience Centers.

Items must be placed at the curb in an organized manner, separated into like piles. The Town will not cleanup or collect items like cars, boats, mobile homes or any other item that will not fit in the dump truck. The Town will provide assistance to elderly and handicapped citizens. 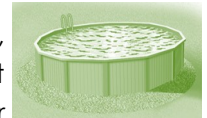

The Town will adjust the sewer portion of the water bill for pool fills once per year per customer.
