MATERIALS ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING

	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE	WHERE TO RECYCLE
ALUMINUM	Aluminum beverage cans.	Do not need to rinse or flatten.	Curbside pickup ; convenience centers.
NEWSPAPERS	Dry newspapers	Do include all newspaper inserts. Do not tie up.	Curbside pickup ; convenience centers.
PLASTIC	Bottles and jars marked by a number 1 or 2 recycling symbol (usually found on the bottom).	Discard caps, rinse and flatten.	Curbside pickup ; convenience centers.
FOOD CANS	Steel (tin) cans used for food and beverages.	Rinse food cans well. Paper labels do not need to be removed.	Curbside pickup ; convenience centers.
GLASS	Clear, green and brown glass food and beverage containers.	Discard lids, rinse jars and bottles. Paper labels do not need to be removed.	Convenience centers.
PAPER BAGS CARDBOARD	Brown paper bags and corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping.	Flatten.	Convenience centers.
APPLIANCES SCRAP METAL	All appliances with metal parts (stoves, washers, dryers, etc.)	Drop off at nearest Convenience Center or York County Landfill.	Convenience centers and York County Landfill.
TEXTILES	Clothing, shoes, bolts, hats, linens, towels, blankets and curtains.	Items must be dry.	Convenience centers.
OIL, FILTERS & BOTTLES	Used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles. Oil must be free of gas, diesel fuel.	Borrow an oil collection container at a Convenience Center. Oil filters and bottles must be empty and leave lids on.	Convenience centers.
BATTERIES	Used automotive, marine, tractor batteries.	Drop off at nearest Convenience Center.	Convenience centers.
PAINT	Latex only, 10 gallons per visit.	Drop off at nearest Convenience Center.	Convenience centers.
E-WASTE	Televisions, computers, monitors and other electronics	Drop off at nearest Convenience Center.	Convenience centers.
